Designated Aboriginal positions are available

As part of our ongoing commitment to meaningful careers for current and future First Nations staff, some of our annual seasonal firefighter roles are offered as Designated Aboriginal Positions.

Seasonal firefighters (officially Seasonal Forest and Fire Operations Officer) work alongside our permanent firefighting staff and help deliver land management activities and respond to bushfires and other emergencies.

In addition to emergency response, as a seasonal firefighter you'll play a critical role in helping keep Victoria safer through:

- Firefighters
- Fire Support Officers
- Rappel Crews

In addition to emergency response, as a seasonal firefighter you'll play a critical role in helping keep Victoria safer through:

- ✓ mulching, mowing, slashing and spraying
- ✓ maintaining fuel breaks
- ✓ maintaining the public land road network
- ✓ fencing and trail maintenance
- ✓ planned burning.

You'll receive training and support relevant to the role you are performing. This may include operating plant and equipment including four-wheel-drives, chainsaws and firefighting equipment.

In a designated position, you'll have access to a statewide Aboriginal staff network of colleagues working across cultural burning, cultural land management and cultural heritage protection.

Employment occurs between October and May, dependent on seasonal requirements. Designated positions run for one season per successful applicant. You must apply for a general role for following seasons.

What do I need to become a seasonal firefighter?

If you like working outdoors and want to be part of a great team that helps protect the community and makes Victoria safer, apply to become a seasonal firefighter now.

If you have a great attitude and you're keen to learn new skills, this role could be perfect for you. We'll train you in everything you need to successfully perform the role.

You'll undergo a thorough selection process to make sure you meet the following requirements.

You must:

- ✓ be an Australian citizen or have a visa which allows you to work in Australia
- ✓ be 18 years old as of 1 October
- ✓ provide a declaration and consent form linked to previous employment
- ✓ have a current National Police Check
- ✓ have a current manual driver's licence
- ✓ only Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people are eligible for designated positions. A Confirmation of Aboriginality form is required.
- ✓ complete a medical and task-based fitness assessment (completed during the recruitment process)
- ✓ become an accredited general firefighter (as part of your training and induction).

As part of your emergency response role, you may be required to work outside of normal hours and on weekends and public holidays. You may be deployed to other locations.

What do you get as a seasonal firefighter?

As a seasonal firefighter, you'll have the opportunity to work in Victoria's great outdoors while receiving extensive training to hone your skills. You'll work alongside great people who are keeping Victoria safer.

- ✓ **Connection to Country:** You'll get to work outdoors, surrounded by nature in some of the most beautiful and remote parts of the state.
- ✓ **Teamwork:** You'll work closely with a diverse group of individuals including other firefighters and emergency responders and support staff to keep Victoria safer from bushfires.
- ✓ **Sense of purpose:** Being a seasonal firefighter brings a great sense of purpose and personal achievement knowing that your efforts contribute to protecting communities and the environment.
- ✓ **Skill development:** You'll receive extensive training in basic fire behaviour, safety protocols, plant and equipment operation and much more. The skills and experience you'll gain as a seasonal firefighter is a great start for a career in environment or emergency management. Many senior staff across DEECA started their career as a seasonal firefighter.
- ✓ **Travel opportunities:** Planned burning and emergency response deployments can occur anywhere across the state, providing opportunities to travel and work in different locations. Some of our former seasonal firefighters have been deployed to support firefighting efforts across Australia and internationally.
- ✓ **Earn and learn:** You will be paid to learn and develop your new skills in an industry where the opportunities are endless.
